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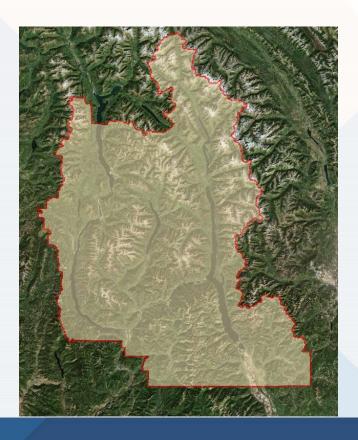


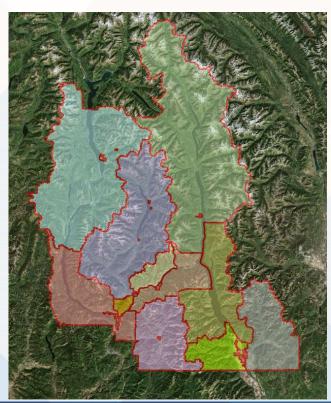
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The map on the left shows the service area for General Administration – the entire RDCK.
