RDCK has joined Recycle BC

In 2020 RDCK Recycling Depots joined the Recycle BC (RBC) program. RBC is a Product Stewardship Program mandated to collect and recycling residential printed paper & packaging.

All RDCK Recycling Depots received upgrades to their collection equipment, security, supervision and new hours of operation.

New materials including plastic bags and Styrofoam are now accepted at the core depots in Nelson (Lakeside Drive), Salmo, Balfour and Kaslo. Visit the RDCK's website to find out about these new materials and how to sort your recycling when brought to a depot.

Areas with Curbside Service

User fees may be doubled for: loads that contain more than 10% recyclable material; unsecured loads; containers larger than the allowable size (121 L); and loads of one category of waste which are contaminated with another.

CONTROLLED WASTE

The disposal of certain materials is strictly controlled due to the challenges they present at the landfill. Some materials may be bulky and therefore require significant space for disposal. Other products may present risks to human or environmental health if they are not disposed of properly. **Consult the full text of the bylaw for more information if you need to dispose of any material in the list below.**

PROHIBITED WASTE

Some materials cannot be disposed of at RDCK facilities because of the unacceptable risks they pose to human or environmental health. Some prohibited wastes, however, may be accepted for recycling. If you need to dispose of any of the materials listed below, contact the Recycling Council of BC (1-800-667-4321 or www.rcbc.bc.ca) or visit www.bcrecycles.ca for information on where to take the product.

- Biomedical waste

- Free liquids

- Loads that are smoldering or on fire
- Out-of-area waste
- Paint products
- Pesticide products

All Controlled Waste items and Prohibited Waste items are defined in the Resource Recovery Facilities Regulatory Bylaw. Consult the full text of the Bylaw to see if your product qualifies.

PRODUCT STEWARDSHIP MATERIALS

Product stewardship programs require producers/retailers of designated materials to collect and recycle their products at end-of-life. These programs are provincially-regulated and apply to all areas of BC. Designated materials should be brought to collection depots—not disposed of with regular garbage or recycling.
