The disposal of certain materials is strictly controlled due to the challenges they present at the landfill. Materials may be bulky, requiring significant space for disposal, or they may present risks to human or environmental health if not disposed of properly. **Consult the full text of the bylaw for more information if you need to dispose of any material in the list below.**

## Product Stewardship Materials

Product stewardship programs are provincially-regulated and apply to all areas of BC. They require producers/retailers of designated materials to collect and recycle their products at end-of-life. Designated materials should be brought to collection depots—not disposed of with regular garbage or recycling.
