He has been with the organization for 9 years and oversees youth and seniors programs on the East Shore.

What is the purpose and goal(s) of the project? The purpose and goal of our East Shore Elder Care Program is focused on helping and supporting our local seniors so that they can age in place, remain in their own homes for as long as possible and to help seniors access programs and services. We run a Social Meals program that operates every Tuesday and Thursday and rotates between 4 community Halls. This program helps foster social connections and combats social isolation. We also provide some meal delivery for seniors that are unwell or unable to attend the program in person. We also operate the East Shore Better at Home program that provides rides for seniors to medical appointments. Our East Shore Youth Program addresses the needs of local youth in the area by organizing events and workshops for youth that provide opportunities based on diverse youth input. Youth are able to travel to events and workshops in Creston and Nelson and this helps to expand social networks and provides access to events outside of the East Shore. We also want to be able to continue to sponsor projects and programs on the East Shore that are initiated by Community Members.

How does this support and help to develop the local economy or add value to the community? This adds value to the community by supporting senior members of our community and providing them with opportunities to connect and participate in local programming that enhances their social connections, and promotes nutrition and combats social isolation. Our programming also provides access to transportation to appointments that are critical for their health and well-being. Our Youth programs provide access to transportation to events and workshops in local communities. The program focuses on skill building, team building, community responsibility and care, and larger opportunities to have fun together in and out of The East Shore. The goal of the program is to educate and empower youth and to improve their well-being, education, physical and mental health. Our intention is to encourage youth as citizens and masters of their own experience, strengthening the resilience of youth in the face of life's challenges, and enabling all young people to meet their basic needs associated with a successful transition to adulthood.

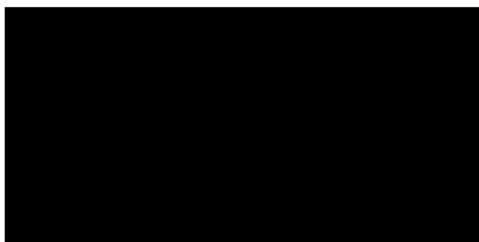

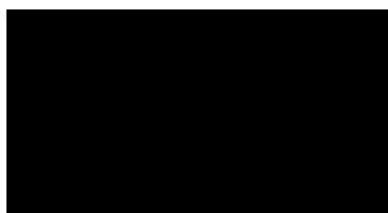

Brief Description of Project:	A local youth, Anora Winger, started a "Learn to Mountain Bike" club in the summer of 2026. She got support from her father, Matt, and Luke Lewis, the President of the East Shore Trail and Bike Association. Youths signed up and on consecutive Wednesdays over the course of the summer, they were taught the basics of mountain biking on the local ESTBA trails in Crawford Bay, Riondel, Wyndel, and Kaslo. As a whole, the summer was quite successful, but there were a number of kids who were not able to take part because of financial considerations (their families did not have access to an appropriate bike), and the group hit its limit in capacity for transporting kids and their bikes. The funding requested is for the purchase of a bike rack capable of transporting six mountain bikes safely and two hardtail bikes so that all kids who would like to take part can do so. The demographic target group is East Shore youths between the ages of 10 and 17. The project goals are to remove financial and logistical barriers for those who would like to take part in the "learn to mountain bike" club. It is unique because, although the East Shore is very rich in incredible trail networks, there are not many parents with the ability or desire to teach their kids how to ride them safely, or to even access the trail hubs. It is a free summer activity program we are offering, fully funded by local support up until this point, but we would like everyone to be able to take part.
Project Location:	The ESTBA trails in Crawford Bay, Riondel, Kaslo, and the Creston Valley Cycling Association trails in Wyndel
Please provide a brief bio/credentials of the main project leader(s):	The two project leaders are Matthew Winger, a Crawford Bay resident who is a high school teacher at KRSS in Creston. He is the former Outdoor Ed and Phys Ed teacher from Crawford Bay ESS. He is also the Chair of the Board for Starbelly Jam Music Festival and their Health and Safety Director. The other project leader is Luke Lewis, the owner of Northwoven Brooms and the President of the East Shore Trail and Bike Association.
What is the purpose and goal(s) of the project?	The purpose of the project is to make our "Learn to Mountain Bike" Club (taking place each consecutive Wednesday afternoon over the summer) accessible and barrier free for local youths who do not have the financial or logistical means to take part in our weekly rides. The two bikes would be available (on top of the three bikes the project leaders have already been loaning to youths all summer this year) to those who need them, and would be maintained by the project leaders. The bike rack capable of transporting six bikes would make it possible for us to transport more youths and their bikes safely to various trail hubs. By having more reliable transportation options, we will also be able to include frequent rides in Wynndel and Kaslo, introducing East Shore youths to other surrounding youth biking club members.
How does this support and help to develop the local economy or add value to the community?	This adds value by creating a valuable summer activity for East Shore youths. It teaches them the basics of mountain biking and introduces them to the local trail networks in a way that makes the terrain less daunting. This adds value to the community by creating a sense of appreciation in local youths for what incredible recreational opportunities are right in their backyards. By getting them introduced to mountain biking locally, it fosters a care in them

for the local environment and our local trails. This, in turn, plants a seed for the next generation of trail builders and maintainers. Also, there is a burgeoning bike tourism industry that many of our local youths are not able to access. By teaching them the basics, and then building their skills over years, this will lead to many possible job opportunities at places like Retallack and perhaps even a local bike shuttle/guide entrepreneur.
